



#### **Steps to Success:**

1. Choose a story from one of the six major world religions (Christianity, Islam, Judaism, Buddhism, Sikhism or Hinduism). Please see below for some suggested links. You can read a story, watch a video of your chosen story or listen to an audio transcript.
2. Think about the key message/moral of the story.
3. Link the message of the story to at least one of the 4Rs (Respect, Reflection, Resilience or Responsibility).
4. Think about how you would like to present your work. It can be:
  - A piece of writing
  - An A3 piece of art work
  - A 3D model (up to A3 size)
  - A story board
  - A creative poster
  - Alternatively, any other creative way you can think of.
5. Your work must include:
  - The story or a summary of the story
  - Which religion the story is from ( you may show this through a religious symbol)
  - The key message
  - Which R it is linked to
6. Hand in your entries to your class teacher by Friday 25 October. Remember to put your full name and class on your entry.

#### **Remember:**

- Each entry is worth 10 house points.
- There will be first, second and third prizes for each year group.
