COVID Update

The DfE have asked school to share the this information about covid vaccines.

Children aged 5 to 11 years who are in a clinical risk group or who live with someone who is immunosuppressed can get the COVID-19 vaccine, in line with advice set out by the <u>Joint Committee on</u> <u>Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI)</u>. Eligible children include those with diabetes, immunosuppression, learning disabilities, and other conditions as outlined by the <u>UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) in the Green Book</u>.

Vaccinations help to increase protection against COVID-19, which is particularly important for those with underlying health conditions.

Further information is available in the <u>guide for parents of children aged 5 to 11 years</u> published by UKHSA. We have published some <u>frequently asked questions</u> on the vaccination programme including information on eligibility, accessibility and advice for parents of children at high risk from COVID-19.

We are trying to remove as many restrictions as we can in school whilst also keeping a close eye on the number of positive cases.

Road Safety

Thank you to everyone who has followed the request to use the main pathway alongside the John Hampden Infant School, before and after school. Please remember to wait at the edges of the pathway so that space is left in the centre. This should help to reduce congestion.

You should not drive onto campus between 0800 and 1600 unless authorised to do so by the school office. Doing so increases the risk of a collision with a child.

Support for Ukraine

We regularly explore world events as part of our curriculum, linking learning to our school values and collective worship themes. Many children have questions about what is happening in the Ukraine and we are exploring these in an age/stage appropriate way.

A number of children have already begun raising money to support the citizens of the Ukraine. We are currently working with the local church team to organise a whole school event to raise money for a suitable charity.

School Uniform

Please ensure that your child is wearing the correct uniform to school. This include black school shoes. If your child is unable to wear a specific item (medical reason, lost item etc) then please email the school office.

We will be checking on school uniform and sending reminder texts to parents as from Monday. We will also be checking that uniform and PE kit is named - children will be awarded house points for named items. Children who do not have a name in kit will be asked to write their name on the label.

British Science Week

Next week is British Science Week. All children will have the opportunity to take part in a national poster competition on the theme of 'Growth' (see attached for details) and there is also a quiz for children to try with their families!

In school we have decided to go with the theme of Climate Change and so children will be taking part in a number of investigations on this important topic.
