# Road Safety

# Curriculum Update

Attached to this newsletter is a maths WINK (What I Need to Know in maths by the end of the year) for each year group. This document sets out what children are expected to know in maths by the end of each academic year. Children and adults in school will be using these to support learning in maths.

Parents can use the WINK and the Curriculum Map to help them talk with their child about learning within a particular maths domain / topic. Instead of 'What did you do today?' you could say, 'Tell me about the columns you use in place value.' Further support for parents in maths and English will be coming soon (how to better support your child's learning).

# Youth for Ukraine Concert

We would like to invite you and your families to a fundraising concert for Ukraine, organised by former WJS pupil Jude Kayakiran, and two of his fantastic young classical musician friends – Emma Harrington (voice), and Lucy Howitt (harp), who won last year's Bucks Young Musician of The Year competition. They will be joined by Jozef Hatton, a senior violinist in Bucks County Youth Orchestra (BCYO), and Emma's brother Thomas Harrington (piano, clarinet, BCYO), and Jude's sister Iris Kayakiran (trumpet, voice, BCYO). The repertoire includes extracts from Chopin's piano concerto No2, Bach's double violin concerto and Haydn's trumpet concerto, as well as Delibes' Flower Duet and some wonderful operatic arias.
