Collective Worship

We have continued to explore our values through bible stories. Recently we thought about Noah and the Ark and the Tower of Babel. God asked Noah to build the ark to save all that was good. After the great flood the people of the Earth united, speaking one language and aspiring to build a tower so high that it would reach Heaven – man would be equal to God. As a result, God gave man all the languages of the world so that they would not understand each other; the tower was never finished. We thought about the messages in these stories: God will always be there for us and never wants us to be arrogant; in creating many languages God has made our world diverse and we celebrate this; despite talking many languages we can speak with one voice through music and art and on important issues.

Children have taken a lead in assembly recently. Our Junior Road Safety Officers spoke about the importance of walking to school, improving our health and helping the environment. Also, a group of Year 6 children shared their concerns about the amount of plastic we throw away each day and the catastrophic impact this has on our world. Will God ask for another ark to be built to rescue us in the future?

It was lovely to see so many of you at our Harvest Festival services at St Mary's last week. Thank you for your generosity in sending in donations for Aylesbury Vineyard Storehouse. We filled 12 crates with food which will be put to very good use supporting local families in need.

PE Safety

During PE lessons the children play a number of invasion games such as football, hockey and tag rugby. Whilst these are not contact sports and we make every effort to ensure the games are as safe as possible, accidents can happen. In order to minimise the risk of injury, it is recommended that children wear a mouthguard for hockey and shin pads for all other games. Mouthguards can be obtained from your dentist (custom fit) or any sports shop (self-fitting). Shin pads are not expensive and should last your child for the whole of their time at junior school.

If your child cannot attend a session for any reason, please do let us know so the register can be updated. We expect children to commit to the clubs they have joined and will offer their place to another child if 3 consecutive sessions are missed (doesn't apply if absence due to injury/illness).
