Sun Protection

We have been blessed with a number of warmer days recently and this will hopefully continue after half term. Children have been reminded about how to take care in the sunshine. Half term is a great opportunity to make sure that children are suitably equipped. We encourage children to: **slip** on a shirt (long sleeved cotton provides better protection against the sun); **slop** on the sunblock before school and during the day (children are allowed to bring a small named tube in each day for personal use, SPF 50+ advised); and **slap** on a sunhat. Additionally they should have a named water bottle in school that they are encouraged to take out for social time and refill at lunchtime.

Gardening Club

We have been working very hard to create a lovely new garden outside the bungalow and are very grateful to Danny Nelson (dad to Freddie and Molly) for his support with this project. He has built us some fantastic raised beds which we have now planted with vegetables, herbs and flowers. The children and staff are very enthusiastic about our garden and we were delighted to receive Level 1 and Level 2 gardening awards from the Royal Horticultural Society in assembly. Thank you to everyone who bought plants today – you helped us raise £157.80 which will be used to further develop the garden.


