Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Application)

Developing Add a passive verb from the word bank (3 options) to complete a single clause sentence, where both the subject and the object are included.

Expected Add a passive verb from the word bank (4 options) to complete a sentence with an expanded noun phrase or a single clause sentence where the object is omitted. Greater Depth Add passive verbs to complete a multi-clause sentence. No word bank provided.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Application)

Developing Choose a passive verb (6 options) and write it in a single clause sentence, where both the subject and the object are included.

Expected Choose a passive verb (6 options including some active verbs) and write it in a sentence with an expanded noun phrase.

Greater Depth Choose 2 passive verbs (9 options including some active verbs) and write them in a multi-clause sentence with no passive objects.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Reasoning)

Developing Explain the mistake made when writing a passive verb in a single clause sentence, where both the subject and the object are included.

Expected Explain the mistake made when writing a passive verb in a sentence with an expanded noun phrase or a single clause sentence where the object is omitted. Greater Depth Explain the mistake made when writing passive verbs in a multi-clause sentence with no passive object.

Application and Reasoning Using the Passive Verb

Developing

1a. kicked

2a. Various answers, for example: The bread was sold by the baker.
3a. Tia is not correct because she has not used 'were' before the past participle of the verb 'to lose'. The correct sentence is: The keys were lost by the girl.

Expected

4a. written

5a. Various answers, for example: The huge parcel was taken in the van by the postman.

6a. Katie is not correct because she hasn't swapped the position of the subject and the object. The correct sentence is: <u>His</u> <u>messy bedroom</u> was tidied <u>by the</u> <u>reluctant boy.</u>

Greater Depth

7a. Various answers, for example: The new board game was played and the points were counted.

8a. Various answers, for example: The goal was scored and it is described as the best in the team's history. The omitted objects could be 'the striker' and 'the journalist' respectively.

9a. Bella is not correct because she has only turned the first part of the sentence into the passive form. The correct sentence is: The white envelope was sealed, and then the postage stamp was stuck on.

Application and Reasoning Using the Passive Verb

Developing

1b. read

2b. Various answers, for example: The marbles were found by Tom.
3b. Seth is not correct because he has only swapped the position of the subject and the object in the sentence; he has not used the passive form. The correct sentence is: The bone was hidden by the dog.

Expected

4b. eaten

5b. Various answers, for example: The old board games are played at wet playtimes.

6b. Greg is not correct because he has not used 'were' before the past participle of the verb 'to leave'. The correct sentence is: The dirty trainers <u>were</u> left in the tidy hallway by Lucy.

Greater Depth

7b. Various answers, for example: The eggs were fried, and then the butter was spread on the toast.

8b. Various answers, for example: The donations will be collected when the hymns are sung. The omitted objects could be 'the volunteers' and 'the choir' respectively.

9b. Alex is not correct because he has only turned the second part of the sentence into the passive form. The correct sentence is: The kitchen floor was mopped after the colourful tiles were wiped.
