Collective Worship

School Planner

Your child should have brought their school planner home today. These are to be brought to and from school each day. The planners contain useful information for children and parents. They are also an excellent way of communicating between home and school (short messages) and children should record their personal reading in them.

Sadly, due to supply issues, the planners were late arriving this term.



Reading Plus

Reading Plus is our online reading platform that we use in and out of school to support the teaching of reading.

Last year, this was rolled out to Year 3 and 4. Year 5 have now completed their baseline assessments and should be able to access the platform. Year 6 will follow after half-term. Please see the attached pdf for more details.



PE Lessons

Physical Education is part of the national curriculum and as such is statutory. Only the teacher can authorise non-participation. Parents must email the school office if they believe accommodations need to be made for their child, eg an injury that restricts / prevents direct participation. All children are expected to take part in lessons as far as they are able.

Children must bring their PE kit to school and the PE kit should be as per the school uniform policy (this includes wearing red or black football socks rather than the socks they wear to school and PE shorts – not leggings). No jewellery should be worn in lessons (parents must provide tape for recently pierced ears). Parents will be informed if their child is not prepared for PE.

Extended Learning Competition – Faith Stories

The first competition of the year has been launched! The challenge is to recount a faith story in 200 words or less, or to illustrate a story. All entries will be rewarded with 10 house points and there will be prizes for the winners. Entries must be handed in by Friday 4 November.

Children may choose a story from the suggested list or choose one of their own. They need to include the moral of the story / how the story helps people to live their lives. We will be collating the winning entries to use in a whole school resource.



Christmas Decoration Competition

We will be launching our annual Christmas Tree Decoration competition after half-term. The decorations will be displayed on the Christmas tree in the centre of Wendover. Children may win a prize or even be asked to switch the Christmas tree lights on.

Children will have until 18 November to design and produce a decoration for the tree in Wendover. All entries need to be brought into school and must be clearly named. Any materials can be used, but must be weather resilient (previous entries have made good use of recycled water bottles / containers).

- Find a safe place to cross, look both ways, walk across the road and continue to look both ways



- We strive to respond to all communications within two working days. However, more complex enquiries may take longer particularly if the input of a number of staff or outside agencies is required.
- Your email will be directed to the most appropriate person in most cases this will be the class teacher. Year leaders / SENDCO / Designated Safeguarding Lead / headteacher may be involved if required. It is therefore, quite possible that the person you sent the message to does not reply to you directly (see appendix A for further clarity of who to contact in the first instance).
