This week has seen us exploring the lives of Martin Luther King and Malala Yousafzai – two people who have changed the lives of many for the better. We thought about how they have used their gifts to bring about positive change, as well as the injustices that they challenged. Children have thought about their gifts and how they could be part of positive change within their community.

The Write Stuff

As you know, last year we changed the way in which we teach writing in school. The Write Stuff is an approach that encourages us to look at writing through different lenses. They provide opportunities for us to develop different features of writing within the same text – typically children will look at two or three different lenses each lesson. The approach also gives ample chances for writers to better understand grammar and to organise their ideas more coherently.

Governors and leaders conducted a deep dive in writing last Friday. We went into lessons, talked to children and looked at examples of writing that the children have completed so far this term. We were very pleased with the level of engagement, how positive the children are about writing and the quality of writing they are producing. Please read the summary of the visit in the following slides.

The Write Stuff – A Deep Dive

We had the pleasure of visiting the school to take part in the Deep Dive into Writing on Friday 13th October. Mrs Khan, the English Lead, introduced the 'Write Stuff' scheme into the school during the last academic year. When we visited in March, Year 6 had already been using the scheme for some time. Following extremely positive feedback from both children and staff, the rest of the school years were beginning to implement it into their daily writing practises. The 'Deep Dive' last Friday was to observe how this implementation had been going throughout the school since our last visit.

In each class we visited, there was an extremely high level of participation. It was a delight to see how keen the children were to share their thoughts with each other (during moments of 'chotting' – a mixture of chatting and jotting) and their teachers. 'Working walls' were covered with children's sentences to demonstrate good examples, allowing all children's work to be celebrated and shared. Children across the years were keen to show us their books and there was a wonderful sense of pride in their work.

Overall, there was great enthusiasm for the new writing scheme amongst the children we spoke to, with a resounding theme of 'it's more supportive' and 'it's less daunting'. They all seemed to have a real understanding of how it was helping them to improve their writing.

Thank you very much to Mrs Khan for the enormous amount of work she has put into introducing this scheme across the school. Thank you, also, to all the teaching staff for embracing it so enthusiastically and working hard to implement it in their classrooms. There seems to be no doubt that the children are benefitting enormously from this writing scheme and the hard work is paying off.

Campus Safety

Online Safety Information

As a school, we teach Online Safety using ProjectEvolve. Our Autumn focus is Self-Image & Identity, Online Reputation and Online Relationships.

Self-image & identity - how people represent themselves online, including avatars used in gaming apps and understanding how our online and offline identities are different. We also learn about how our online identity may change depending on what we are doing online. For example, our eSchools and Reading Plus identity would be different to a gaming identity that we use for games like Roblox or Minecraft. This strand also looks at challenging gender and stereotypes online.

Online Reputation - what is safe to share online, the need to be careful before sharing anything online and about asking permission before sharing information about others online.

Online Relationships - creating a positive online presence, making responsible choices that supports and interacts respectfully with others and creates healthy online behaviours. This includes how we behave in group chats on eSchools or gaming chats etc. This strand also focusses on what people can do if they or others feel upset or worried by something they see or hear online.

To support your child at home, we have included two parent information sheets within this week's newsletter: 'How to create a great environment for kids to talk' and 'Parent Online Safety Guide'.

Extended Learning Competition


