Worship

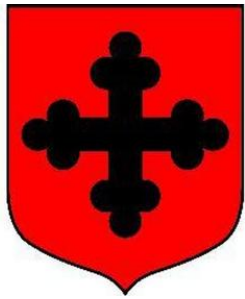
