Over the next five weeks, we will be exploring the themes of **inequality and injustice**. This week, children have thought about what these terms mean.

We began thinking about these terms in relation to sports. As an introduction to Black History Month, we then explored how the actions of Rosa Parks and Guy Bailey challenged inequality and injustice.

Weekly Highlights

Year 3

Year 3 children are revisiting addition and subtraction knowledge, ready to learn about column addition and subtraction in their coming maths lessons

Children have continued to enjoy practical learning while investigating magnet strength during science lessons Children are preparing to write their own story, 'Katie in Wendover' after planning carefully, thinking about including adjectives, verbs, adverbs and similes!

Year 4

The Year 4 children have shown great curiosity when learning about volume and pitch in Science and resilience when trying to make pan pipes that work. They have also worked hard on their responses to some difficult comprehension questions on Victorian poetry in guided reading.

Year 5

Year 5 enjoyed learning about Newton's 3 laws of motion this week. They learned that inertia is not such a scary word, and that the three laws actually make a lot of sense. Then they devised their own experiments to test all three laws. It was very interesting!

Year 6

This week, Year 6 have drafted, edited and published their newspaper reports based on the story of the Three Little Pigs - a wonderful range of creativity and journalism!

Afterschool Spanish club is going really well. The children have been excited to learn new topics in Spanish as well as improve their speaking, reading and writing skills. "I find Spanish club really enjoyable! We always do things that aren't too hard and we get to have squash and biscuits too!" (Maya - Year 6)

Attendance

Schools are required to monitor attendance regularly and take appropriate action where there are concerns. The local authority have a clear process for monitoring attendance; the local liaison group of school follows this process and works together to improve school attendance.

The correlation between high attendance, achievement and mental health & wellbeing is well documented. High attendance also helps children develop positive attitudes and habits that will help them in their next stage of education and work. Our school attendance target is 97% and our average attendance this school year is 96%.

We inform parents if there are concerns about their child's attendance rate, patterns of attendance or punctuality. We may then offer support to help improve attendance. We are obliged to inform the local authority if there are 15 days of illness (consecutive or non-consecutive), if children have 5 or more days of unauthorised leave in a 10 week rolling period or if attendance continues to be of concern.

Please remember that routine medical appointments should not be during the school day. Any leave of absence must be requested using the LOA application form.
